Brief Agency History: The Drop Inn Center was founded in the 1970's and took root in the home of a local resident who invited homeless people into his own home so they would not die on the streets of Cincinnati. His idea of an actual shelter formalized in 1973 and began as an evening only shelter for the homeless located in a series of storefronts in the Cincinnati neighborhood of Over-the-Rhine. In 1978 the volunteer forces of the Drop Inn Center made the famous "Peoples Move" to the former Teamsters Hall at 217 W. 12th Street where the shelter remains today. The Drop Inn Center is known today as Cincinnati's largest homeless shelter serving more than 3,700 homeless individuals a year.
